The Highlands County Board of County Commissioners is seeking applicants for membership on the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC). The HPC is comprised of seven volunteer members, and at this time there are two vacant positions. The HPC was created by the Board of County Commissioners to promote the educational, cultural and economic welfare of the people by establishing uniform procedures to preserve the county's historic resources and by enhancing public participation and involvement in the preservation and protection of such resources. Highlands County was established in 1921 and has a rich and fascinating past.

The Board welcomes all applications; however special consideration will be given to applicants with the following backgrounds: architecture, landscape architecture, accounting, building design, history, architectural history, planning, archaeology, real estate development, law, building construction or other historic preservation related disciplines, such as urban planning, American studies, American civilization, cultural geography or cultural anthropology.

The HPC is scheduled to meet the 2nd Thursday of January, April, July and October. Volunteers serve four-year terms.
